


JAPAN AS THE TOP DEVELOPMENT PARTNER

Japan has been, and continues to be, the largest ODA donor to the Philippines with a total assistance comprising 61% of the entire ODA received by the Philippines in 2020.



LONG HISTORY OF FRIENDSHIP

Japan's first Official Development Assistance (ODA) project started in 1966. Since then, over USD 34 billion in grants, loans, and technical assistance have been provided all over the country, from Batanes to the conflict-affected region in Bangsamoro.



STEP (Special Terms for Economic Partnership)

Extremely concessional loan provided by Japan (0.1% interest rate, 40 years repayment period, with 10-year grace period).

35 mins from Quezon City to NAIA


Proposed in 1973, the construction of the very first subway in the Philippines is finally underway. Once completed, travel time between NAIA and Quezon City will be reduced to 1/2 of the current travel time or only 35 minutes. BGC and Ortigas will also become much closer.

COMMUTING IN COMFORT SOON

MALOLOS-TUTUBAN PHP 110 B, EXTENSION PHP 76 B, as of 2021 (JICA STEP Project)

300,000 daily commuters will soon enjoy a reduced travel time of only 35 minutes from Malolos, Bulacan, to Tutuban, Manila. Subsequent extension to Clark International Airport and Calamba, Laguna, is also conceived to halve the current travel time between them to just 2 hours.



LRT-1 and LRT-2 Extension: PHP 20 B




The LRT Line 1 South Extension, LRT Line 2 East Extension, and MRT-3 Rehabilitation aim to improve transportation connectivity, mitigate road congestion, and revitalize the economy of Metro Manila.

The LRT Line 1 will be extended to Cavite, and LRT Line 2 to Antipolo. Metro Manila is becoming highly connected and more accessible to neighboring cities.

GATEWAY TO THE FUTURE (JICA STEP Project)

Inaugurated in 2018, the new airport received so many local and foreign tourists excited to visit the most popular island resorts in the Philippines, even in the time of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Communications, Navigation, Surveillance / Air Traffic Management (CNS/ATM) Systems: PHP 10 B

Came into service in 2018 to monitor and control air traffic 24/7 to ensure punctuality and absolute safety of the Philippine skies.



Mindanao Container Terminal Project: PHP 3.6 B

Aims to relieve port congestion and promote smooth logistics. A new container terminal was constructed at the Port of Cagayan de Oro, contributing to an increase in container cargo.

Subic Port Development: PHP 7.5 B **Subic Bay Masterplan**

Located about 80km North-West of Metro Manila, the new Container Terminal increases international cargo handling and contributes to economic development in the Philippines.

Additionally, Japan is supporting the formulation of the Subic Bay Regional Development Master Plan to promote development in this region by taking into consideration port and road infrastructure, industry, tourism, and maritime safety.

Japan proactively supports health sector improvement by "leaving no one's health behind" towards achieving the SDG goal of universal health coverage.

NATION BUILDING STARTS WITH HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT

As one of the most important pillars of Japan's assistance, the Japanese Government promotes assistance not only in primary education, but also educational opportunities, such as higher education, vocational training, and practical training in administration and other areas in support of the long term development of the Philippines

Project for Human Resource Development Scholarship (JDS): Approximately PHP 153 M Annually



Since 2002, JDS has sent 399 Philippine government officials with full scholarship for Masters or Doctoral degrees to top Japanese universities. Around 20 officials are sent to Japan annually.





SOUTHEAST ASIA JICA-JAXA NETWORK FOR UTILIZATION OF SPACE



CubeSat released from Space Station

JICA and JAXA provide basic specialized training for Southeast Asian space-related agency officials at Japanese graduate schools. Many Philippine researchers studying space are developing technologies at Japanese universities microsatellites and nanosatellites under this initiative.

KCCP allows Filipino Young Leaders to visit Japan to share and learn knowledge in various fields.


MEXT (MINISTRY OF EDUCATION, CULTURE, SPORTS AND TECHNOLOGY) SCHOLARSHIP

Japan has been extending assistance since 2002, even before the signing of the "Comprehensive Agreement on Bangsamoro" in 2014, to contribute to the peace process in the Bangsamoro region under three pillars;

GRASSROOTS HUMAN SECURITY COOPERATION

Grant Assistance for Grassroots Human Security Projects (GGP)

A Japanese ODA scheme to support small-scale projects at the grassroots level for the socio-economic growth of the Philippines. As of March 2022, GGP is supporting 553 projects nationwide including education, water management, and provision of health sector equipment.

Japan Overseas Cooperation Volunteers (JOCVs)

The Philippines is one of four countries Japan dispatched the very first JOCVs to in 1966. Since then, over 1,600 Japanese men and women who aspire to contribute to the social and economic development of the Philippines are engaged in these activities to strengthen ties with the Filipinos.
